GSA included in 5-member Committee to Review Axle Load Operation in Ghana



The GSA has been named in a 5-member committee set up by the Minister for Roads and Highways, Kwame Agbodza, to review the operations of the Axle Load Control Programme to enhance its effectiveness and efficiency.

As a result, the Ministry is seeking to reform the Axle Load Control Programme, which is facing numerous operational challenges.
