

GSA Meets Local Cable Manufacturers on Digital Conformity Marking of Cabels

As part of efforts to increase the quality and safety of electrical cables in Ghana, the GSA has initiated the Digital Conformity Marking of Cables in the country.

The initiative, currently in its pilot phase, will enable every stakeholder, including consumers, to authenticate products and report non-compliance, while helping the Authority to gain real-time visibility about the level of compliance in the market.

In light of the initiative, officials of the Electrical Engineering Department of the GSA met with local cable manufacturers on Wednesday, February 19,

2025, to discuss the initiative and seek their buy-in.

Ing. Francis Akpaloo, during the engagement with the local cable manufacturers, noted that the initiative is tailored towards improving local production of electrical cables and will help reduce unfair competition and increase competitiveness of legitimate producers and importers.

He urged them to support the initiative and knock on the doors of the Authority to help move the industry forward. He took them through the programme and answered

questions posed by the stakeholders.

The stakeholders were happy with the initiative, stating that it will help improve their businesses and will ultimately lead to a safer electrical sector.
